### Curriculum

Our Curriculum has continued to develop a significant pace over the year to ensure that our children's learning is sequenced into manageable components, supporting pupils to develop a deep body of knowledge across Curriculum.

Building on initiatives to explicitly teach and expand pupils' vocabulary, we have worked hard to develop a discussion toolkit across the Curriculum in 2022-23 – strengthening our pupils' application of vocabulary during discussion and in writing.

## Reading

We delivered our 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Book drop in Autumn 2022. This year, all of the texts shared an environmental sustainability theme. Our children have created displays and filmed book reviews to celebrate and share key sustainability messages with a wider audience.

This year, we have written our reading strategy document to share with all members of our School Community. The impact of our new synthetics phonics scheme alongside high quality texts provided to our children, has been evident in pupils progress and confidence this year.

We continue to promote a strong reading culture throughout School and across the Curriculum, with our library resources reviewed and updated on an annual basis.



This year, we have continued to deliver an exciting, engaging and inspirational arts and culture curriculum supported by visiting artists, educational visits, School performances and creative learning opportunities. Our long-term drawing project, working alongside Illustrator and Digital Artist, Angie Thompson, was concluded with **'I am Queen Elizabeth II'** this year. We have further enriched our children's Art and Culture experiences through our Holiday Activity Programme and received funding from Redrow Housing Development to commission an outdoor Totem Installation of flora and fauna species in the school grounds.

Our children's sketchbooks continue to demonstrate an exceptional standard of drawing, painting, and other art forms as our children progress through our Art and Design Curriculum.

## **Education Recovery**

We have utilised all available funding routes to deliver additional booster sessions, reading enrichment groups, small group intervention and 1:1 tutoring for **71** children before or after school this year.

#### Technology Innovation

We have continued to build on and invest heavily in our Technology strategy and grown in confidence with our use of Apple technology to support teaching and learning. 1:1 devices have been introduced for pupils from Year 2, improving access to a wealth of tools and visuals to support our approach to adaptive teaching. Our teachers and children have worked alongside an Apple Professional Teacher to develop use of apple applications to the Curriculum.

We continue to deliver our Digital Literacy Curriculum from EYFS -Year 6 to support our pupils in progressively developing the knowledge and skills they need to stay safe online. This has been closely monitored and developed to support the pace of technology innovation.

#### Enrichment

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The day of outdoor and adventurous activity was beneficial for developing confidence, resilience, and a bit of independence.

We have further developed and extended our range of before, lunchtime and after school enrichment opportunities, providing our children with a wealth of artistic and sporting opportunities.

Over the course of the academic year, we have delivered **2** residential visits, **15** Educational visits, attended **49** Sports fixtures and welcomed **17** visitors to School.

Our children have all had a performance opportunity this year with our EYFS Nativity, Year Group Assemblies, Carol Concert, Sing Together Concert, Young Voices Concert, Eddie the Penguin Musical, our Coronation Presentation and The Pirates of the Curry Bean!



#### **Environmental Impact**

Following the launch of our Green Pledge in 2022, we have strengthened our Environmental Sustainability Education through our **'It's Up to Us'** challenge this year. Each class completed 10 tasks to raise the profile of the small, every-day actions, that can impact positively on our School, local and global environment.

Our children can talk with confidence about how to save energy, water and resources and have led a series of assemblies to share their learning this year.

We have planted new trees to offset the loss of our mature willow trees in our Forest School.


Our PTA Nearly New Uniform Shop continues to promote sustainable clothing options for our families, raising £209 this year for our School.

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We continue to reduce our paper use, utilising technology to share visual prompts and resources with pupils in lessons. The positive environmental impact and financial saving can be evidenced this year alongside the reduction in electricity use since installing automatic LED lighting through our hall, corridors and as part of classroom refurbishments.

We have installed a flora and fauna interpretation board in our School grounds to strengthen our pupils knowledge of local plant and animal biodiversity.



In 2022-2023, we have reduced our electricity use by 14,633kWh. An 11% reduction compared to 2021-2022.



# **Emotional Wellbeing**

Building on our developments in 2021-2022, we have undertaken significant work to develop our policy, provision and approach to supporting pupils emotional wellbeing this year.

We have developed a new Whole School Behaviour Policy, in consultation with our Parents and Carers and a Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) Policy.

Our teaching and support staff have all undertaken Emotion Coaching Training to support the implementation of a whole school approach to developing pupils' ability to identify a range of emotions and develop emotional regulation. We have already seen the positive impact of this work through our children's ability to articulate their emotions and ability to apply strategies in a variety of situations.

Our Staff and Pupils have all participated in a wellbeing questionnaire this term. This work supports the development of Curriculum priorities moving forward. We recognise that the development of strong, trusted relationships is key to supporting children's emotional wellbeing and we see this as a real strength of our School.

We have further developed our School website to support families in quickly accessing information and local support services.

#### School Games Platinum Mark

We have continued to excel in the field of School Sport this year and have achieved the School Games Platinum Mark Award for the 2022/23 academic year. The School Games Mark celebrates our engagement in the School Games, our effort to keep our children active, delivery of school enrichment clubs and coaching and a comprehensive high quality PE curriculum.

In addition to this, the award recognises our commitment to fostering active habits throughout the school day – making Sherwood one of the most active schools in Lancashire!

We are extremely proud of our pupils and staff for their dedication to all aspects of physical activity and school sport.

We are delighted to be awarded with the Lancashire Music Mark this year. This recognition is given by the Lancashire Music Service in recognition of the high value we place on music at Sherwood and our commitment to working with partners to develop our provision.
