


English

Maths

This week, we have been working on solving division calculations using the chunking method. Please watch the video (found under [Year 5 modelled videos on the website](#)) and then complete page 25 of your maths book. On question 4, it asks for the remainder to be written as a fraction. We have not done this yet so just write it as a remainder. (e.g. 34 r3)
Don't forget your fact box and double check your work by estimating the answer first.

READING WITH YOUR CHILD

Spelling focus

As we come towards the end of term, we would like you to review the Year 5 common exception words. Ask someone at home to test you on these words and then practice the ones you got wrong. Think about the different rules that we have looked at- can you apply these? Try sounding the word out into syllables. Write it down – does it look right?
