CORE LEANING TASK FOR ENGLISH

A big hello again. We would like you to watch a special 'Year 3 Assembly' which we hope brings us together in some way. We miss you so much and are so proud of you.

For today's English task, we will focus on two things:

Grammar: Write a list of ten adverbs to describe how YOU like to do things at home. Think really carefully and try to use really different ones. Here is my example list:

Now put them in sentences. 'Shockingly, I walked across the lane without looking because I thought there would be no cars'

Writing: Return to The Grunts. Pick your favourite character. Imagine you had them round for tea.
Write about what happened. Call your piece
'The day xxxxx came round for tea'. Think about what food they wanted to eat, their manners, what your family thought....did you have fun? A model example is on the webpage.

CORE LEARNING TASK FOR MATHEMATICS

It's time to recall subtraction using the formal calculation method.

Watch the video tutorial and have a go at solving these problems using the formal calculation method.

- 1. A bird had 57 feathers and 23 blew away. How many were left?
- 2. James gave 45 of his sweets to Thomas. He had 78. How many did have left?
- 3. Hanna gave Zayd 143 mini eggs out of a total of 200. How many were left?
- 4. Mrs Barker tripped up and dropped the school eggs for decorating. She broke 325 out of 471. How many were left to paint?
- 5. Mrs Holt gave Mrs Pike 245 mini Oreos for her birthday. She kept 72 for herself. How many did she have in total? *

Challenge: Can you write some of your own problems and solve them in the same way? *What is different about this problem and why?
