Core Learning Tasks for Thursday, 7th May, 2020



CORE LEARNING TASK FOR ENGLISH

Sing the song, *There's a Tiny Caterpillar on a Leaf* from Mrs Brown's video.

Watch the video *A Butterfly is Born*. The book is read in two parts, so watch the video after that one too. Recap on the lifecycle of a butterfly, discussing new vocabulary, such as, **emerging, hard shell, nectar, pupa, tongues, wings**. Mrs Brown talks about **symmetry** and **symmetrical**. Discuss this and the patterns by pausing the video on the first page of the book.

Your task is to:

- Draw a butterfly with a symmetrical pattern. If you have paint, you could paint it. Another suggestion is to print it by folding the paper in half, painting one side of the butterfly and printing a pattern on the other half! Discuss the **mirror image** and the **line of symmetry** being down the middle.
- Write colour words on cards. Read them and go on a colour hunt around the house. Hold the 'yellow' card next to a yellow flower or a yellow vase, etc.



CORE LEARNING TASK FOR MATHEMATICS

Please complete the assigned tasks on Mathematics. In our core learning, we continue to learn about **time**.

Today we are going to learn our days of the week (Monday – Sunday).

- Begin by singing the days of the week song by clicking on the following link: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8GKmCQOy88Y>.
- Write down each day of the week on separate pieces of paper. Practice recognising and reading each day of the week.
- Mix all of the days of the week up and have a go at putting them in the correct order.
- On the back of each day of the week, have a go at drawing what The Very Hungry Caterpillar ate on each day. For example, on Monday you would draw one apple.
