## PHONICS FOCUS

On Espresso, Foundation – Phonics. Complete videos and activities. Write sentences (or short captions if Orange/ Blue) on a whiteboard with a whiteboard pen if you have one.

Oranges – Polly's Phonics – ai & recap on all sounds so far.

Blues – Polly's Phonics – igh & recap ch/sh/th/ng/ai/ee

Yellows – Polly's Phonics – or, ur, ow

Reds – Polly's Phonics – air, ure, ear & tricky words Purples–Kim's Phonics –words beginning CCC & long words

Greens - Ash's Phonics - ie, igh, i\_e,

#### <u>KEY MENTAL MATHS SKILLS TO</u> <u>REHEARSE ORALLY – **ESTIMATION**</u>

- Place numbers 1-20 in a bag
- Ask someone at home to choose a number and collect this number of objects from around your home (if you have counters that would be great)
- Have a quick look and **estimate** how many they have
- Check by counting remember to count slowly, pushing the objects into a line as you count
- If appropriate extend beyond 20 and group the objects into groups of 2s, 5s or 10s to help you count how many there are

- Listen out careful for any parts of the story that are repeated (repeated refrains). Can you join in?

#### MOTOR SKILLS FOCUS FOR MINIBEASTS TOPIC

Make a spider's web using a paper plate (or cut out a large circle from a piece of paper). Ask a grown up to punch holes around the outside. Now weave string in and out. Remember your web needs a spider!



In your Remote Learning Book, complete the handwriting lesson by Mrs Brown that is posted in Remote Learning EYFS, Week 6. Remember to: **1. Lead in from the line each time.** 

 Clearly form tall letters (ascenders) "up, up to the sky" and letters that hang under the line (descenders) have a loopy tail!
The curved part ("tummy") sits on the line.
