CORE LEARNING TASK FOR ENGLISH

We hope you are enjoying listening to 'George's Marvellous Medicine' by Roald Dahl.

Let's have fun with one of the great techniques Mr Dahl uses – **onomatopoeia** (on -oh -mat – oh -pea -yah!) This is when the language used matches the sound it makes in real life (buzz, whizz, crash!) He uses it a lot when he describes the medicine brewing and the growing size of Grandma!

All you have to do is find as many **LOUD WORDS** as you can which match the following subjects:

- A can of coke opening
- Chicken frying in a pan
- The cork of a bottle popping out
- Animals being fed at the zoo
- Year 3 children in the playground

CORE LEARNING TASK FOR MATHEMATICS

Remember our learning about perpendicular and parallel lines? In your remote learning books, answer the questions.

The example reminds you that:

1. Parallel lines stay equal distance apart
2. Perpendicular lines meet at a right angle (90 degrees) like the corner of a square.

 Recognise perpendicular and parallel lines

Challenge 1
 The corners of the football pitch are marked A, B, C and D.
 a Which side is parallel to side AB?
 b Which side is perpendicular to side DC?

Challenge 2
 This is Helen's house.
 1 a Name two pairs of perpendicular lines.
 b Name one pair of parallel lines.
 2 a Draw the shapes below on squared paper.
 b Mark all the perpendicular and parallel lines.

You will need:
 • 1 cm squared paper
 • ruler

Example
 The cube is on a horizontal table.
 Look at the face labelled A, B, C and D.
 Name two pairs of sides which are:
 a perpendicular to the table top
 b parallel to the table top
