Core Learning Tasks for Thursday, 14th May, 2020



CORE LEARNING TASK FOR ENGLISH

Begin by watching the minibeasts video on espresso again (see the overview for more details on how to find the video)

Minibeasts are quite simply small animals. They are also called invertebrates. They do not have a backbone. This makes them soft and bendy. Some minibeasts live in a hard shell to protect themselves.

Go on a minibeast hunt in your garden or around your local park. What minibeasts can you find? You could take pictures or draw the minibeasts you find.

Where did you find the minibeasts? Where minibeasts live is called their 'habitat.' For example they might live under a rock, on a leaf, on a flower or in the water.

Write a list of the different minibeasts you find. Can you write some sentences to tell me where different minibeasts live?

Don't forget a super sentence needs **a capital letter**, **finger spaces** and **a full stop**!



CORE LEARNING TASK FOR MATHEMATICS

Please complete the assigned tasks on Mathletics. In our core learning today, we are going to learn how to recognise number names up to twelve (and beyond if appropriate).

- Create your own number cards (zero-twelve). Ask a grown-up to write the number names so you can copy them. On your card you need the number in numerals, (6) and the number in words (six). Place these around your home and practice reading the number words. Use your phonics to help you sound out the words.
- Set up a game of pairs. To do this you will need to create two number cards for the numbers 0-12. On each card write the number in words (one). Place all the cards face down. Choose two cards. Read the numbers names. Are they the same? If they are the same you can keep them! See who can find the most pairs.

**You do not need to use all numbers (0-12) in one game. If you feel there are too many, split the numbers into two groups and play each group separately.*
