

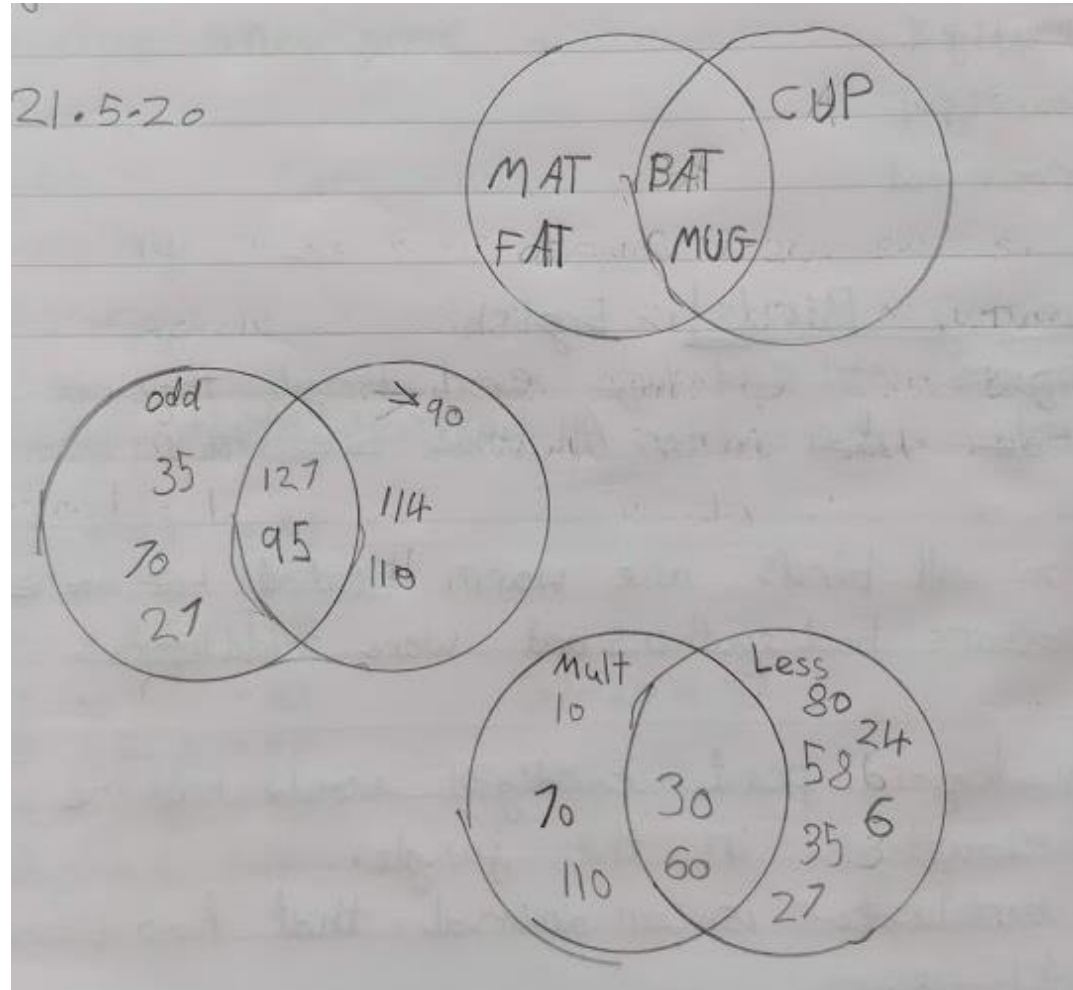

Great Tit

The great tit is 12.5-14.0 cm long and weighs 16-21 grams. It is a song bird, and has up to 40 kinds of songs and sounds. In the summer it eats insects and spiders.



Budgerigar

They're One of the Smallest True Parrot Species. Most budgies in captivity average between 7 or 8 inches from the beak to the tip of the tail.





Robin

Juvenile **robins** have a brown rather than red breast; they grow the red feathers after their first molt.

British **robins** seldom move far from where they hatched, but many Finnish and Swedish **robins** migrate to the Mediterranean for the winter.

Dove

Today collared doves are fast colonising North America and North Africa. This bird is the seventh most frequently seen species in British gardens and the population has reached 230,000 pairs. Within 20 years they had colonised every county in the British Isles, and had even reached Shetland and the Outer Hebrides.





Peacock

Only the males are actually “**peacocks**.” A family of **peafowl** is called a “bevy.” They're not born with their fancy tail feathers. They don't have to be killed for their feathers. They can fly, despite their all-white massive trains. There are **peafowl**.



Humming Bird

They are the smallest migrating bird....
The name, hummingbird, comes from
the **humming** noise their wings make
as they beat so fast.



Owl

There are around 200 different **owl** species.

Owls are active at night (nocturnal).

A group of **owls** is called a parliament.

Most **owls** hunt insects, small mammals and other birds.

Some **owl** species hunt fish.

Owls have powerful talons (claws) which help them catch and kill prey.

Owls have large eyes and a flat face.



Humming Bird

- 1.** They are the smallest migrating bird. They don't migrate in flocks like other species, and they typically travel alone for up to 500 miles at a time.
- 2.** The name, hummingbird, comes from the humming noise their wings make as they beat so fast.
- 3.** Hummingbirds are the only birds that can fly backwards.



Humming Bird

Hummingbirds have no sense of smell. While they can't sniff out feeders, they do have good colour vision. Some birds like the Ruby-throated Hummingbird prefer orange or red flowers. Despite this, red dye should not be used in nectar as it could harm the birds. Instead, plant naturally red or orange flowers or use feeders that have red colouring in their structure.

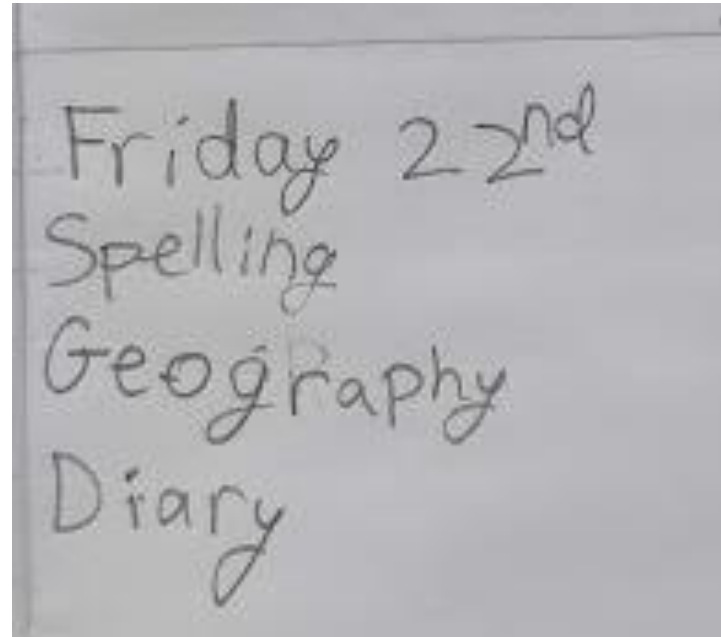

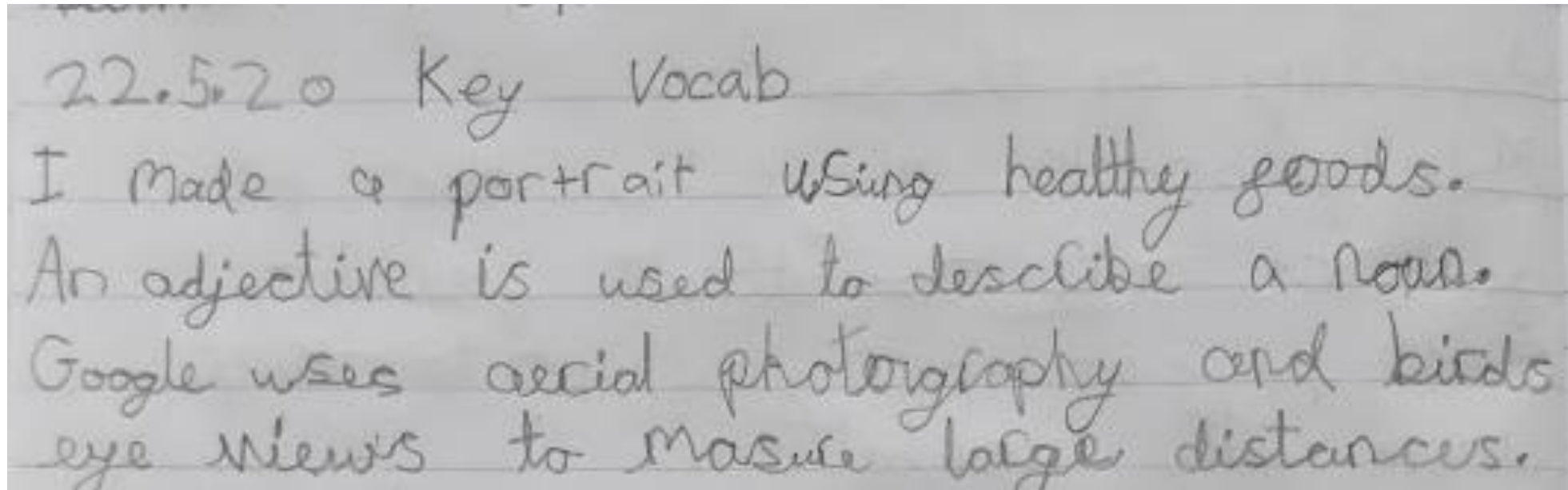
