






Climate is the average condition of the atmosphere taken over a period of time. It includes information on a variety of different aspects including rainfall and temperature.




Climate graphs show two types of information in the same graph. The most frequently depicted information shown is rainfall and temperature. The temperature shown is the average daily high and it is measured in centigrade or Celsius. The rainfall is measured in millimetres.


Reading climate graphs can be confusing in that it has two scales. One scale depicts temperature and the other scale depicts rainfall. It is important to use the correct one when reading information from a climate graph.



Climate Graph for London, United Kingdom





