Monday 25th January – Jack and the Beanstalk Day 1



CORE LEARNING TASK

This week we are going to continue our learning of Traditional Tales. Our story for this week is Jack and the Beanstalk. Watch the video of Mrs Hanson reading the story with Jerry. You could also listen to the story here:

Draw/paint a picture of the beanstalk and what you would like to find at the top. Maybe you could use Lego, playdoh or some junk modelling to re-create what you would like to find at the top, depending on your ideas.

MOTOR SKILLS TASK

Curly Caterpillars – this week we are going to practise our monster zig zag letters – v, w, x, z. Watch the video of Mrs Hanson telling us what to do today, focusing on our patterns.

One Arm Robots – today we are going to make a tall, beanstalk like tower using playdoh and buttons. You will need a tub of playdoh or similar and some buttons, the larger the better. Make lots of small balls using your playdoh and then make a tower alternating a playdoh ball with a button.

Ladder Letters – today we are going to make a beanstalk using playdoh/salt dough or similar. You will need to roll out a long thin piece of dough for your stalk and then roll small balls and press them into leaf shapes to add the leaves onto your beanstalk. Challenge yourself to make it as long as possible.

MATHEMATICS TASK

Let's Compare

Today you are going to compare heights of people and objects.

We would like you to make a beanstalk, (It doesn't have to be fancy, just a strip of paper will do but make sure it's the full height of a door) and Blu Tack/stick it to the back of a door in your house.

You will be using this beanstalk again during the week. Also make two labels:

tallest

shortest

Now we would like you to stand against the beanstalk and get an adult to mark on the beanstalk, where the top of your head comes to. Now measure all the other members of your household. Who is the tallest? Add the label. Who is the shortest? Add the label.

Remember to take a photograph of your finished work and add it to SeeSaw.

PHONICS TASK

BLUES - please practise all the sounds you have learnt so far in foundation: s/a/t/p/i/n/m/d/g/o/c/k/ Play 'What's in the box?' Collect a range of objects/pictures which contain the sounds above: eg, hat, map, cat, tin, dog. Place them in a box and write the names of the objects on individual pieces of paper. Ask your child to sound out each word. Can they find the matching object in the box? Please watch the video of Miss Brown modelling how to play the game on seesaw.

YELLOWS - please practise last week's sounds: h/b/f/ff/I/II

Today's new sound: /ss/. Follow the link below and learn all about the sound /ss/ We call this sound a 'diagraph' because two letters make one sound.

Practise reading the high frequency words: dad and mum.

Practise reading the words: miss, kiss, less and mess. Add the sound buttons and sound line to each word (eq, miss) We add a sound line to 'ss' to show that two letters make one sound.

REDS – please practise last week's sounds: **II/ss** ● ●

Practise reading the words: of/mum/dad/up

Ask a grown-up to write the following words on individual pieces of paper: hill, tell, sell, mess, fuss, fill. Turn the cards over and on the back write the numbers 1-6. Roll a dice, count the number of spots and find the matching card. Turn the card over and have a go at reading the word. Can you read all the words? Now have a go at spelling the words.

PURPLES – please practise all the sounds you have learnt so far in foundation: s/a/t/p/i/n/m/d/g/o/c/k/ck/e/u/r/h/b/f/f/l/ll/ss. Practise reading the words: off and can.

Today's new sound: /j/ Follow the link below and learn all about the sound /j/
