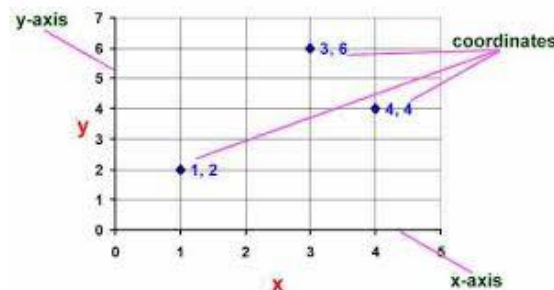
Now watch today's video exploring the use of coordinates.

- read the y axis second (vertical)
