Some words have letters that make no sound. These are known as silent letters and are there because the words either used to be pronounced differently or they have been borrowed from other languages.

They can appear at the beginning of words:

gnarl, know, wrapper

They can appear within the words:


foreign, rhyme, sign

They can appear at the end of the words:

autumn, lamb, thumb

Other words have vowels that make very little sound, depending on how we pronounce them. These are known as unstressed vowels. Because we don't sound them out, they can be difficult to spell:

definite, difference, exercise, family, February, interesting, separate, vegetable g and k are usually silent when they are followed by n.



 \boldsymbol{w} is usually silent at the start of a word when it is are followed by \boldsymbol{r} .

b can be silent after m and before t at the end of words.
