We discussed how MS had taken over from SR as lead for the Eco warriors and how we might move forward. We then took time to look over the page on the School website to discuss what had happened and gone before along with a short discussion of where we might like to go with this council this year.	MS
Suggestion Boxes	<p>Children brought suggestions from the class suggestion boxes.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Litter picks every Friday performed by the Eco council or a particular class. Some of the children suggested local area litter picks as well where a class might be involved. We discussed how this might be appropriate in the school grounds but we must consider Health and Safety and have the right equipment to perform the job. MS to look into. Local area litter picks may be a possibility. Further investigation needed. Suggestion of plant a tree for every child across the school. MS informed the children that this had been done before and gave success as the Forest school area shows. To replace trees we have lost, it could be a possibility for the spring or summer term. Ms to investigate and to speak to JL as to the effectiveness and possibility of organising. Pyjama day. One of the children suggested in the pretence of saving water. MS to investigate. Sunflower race. Suggestion made as to a competition for each class to grow their own Sunflower, with the winning class receiving a prize. Children saw this as a good opportunity to link in with the Science curriculum and sustainability and Wildlife with the Sunflower heads being used for birds in the winter months. Habitat enhancement within the school grounds linked to wildlife.
