Sustainability at Sherwood

Our Curriculum remains at the heart of our Sustainability and Climate Plan. For our children, this includes a wealth of outdoor learning opportunities that are aimed to strengthen our children's knowledge of local biodiversity. We also value the physical, mental and social benefits from outdoor learning.

We have renewed our Year 4 Curriculum this year to include a new 'renewable energy' unit of learning.

Our children have also been challenged to identify 25 species of local fauna and flora, to support and develop their knowledge of local biodiversity and habitat protection. Our children have engaged exceptionally well in our challenge - fostering a vital connection with nature in our local area.

#### Curriculum

Our Subject Leaders have worked hard to continuously evaluate the impact of our curriculum on the standard of our children's learning.

This year we have reviewed our Curriculum sequence of learning for Religious Education to ensure that children have the opportunity to revisit prior learning in a timely manner through the key stages. Our RE Curriculum has also been enhanced this year through the Building Bridges Project, providing a link to faith visitors - strengthening our teaching of beliefs and practices across all faith.

Our PSHE Curriculum has also been reviewed this year to ensure that our curriculum content is meeting the needs and addressing the challenges faced by our children: Emotional Wellbeing, Awareness of Money matters, Staying Safe.

# Sherwood's Oracy Strategy

Our Listening Ladder and Discussion Guidelines continue to be a key part of our pedagogy across the curriculum through all key stages. The strategy has developed well this year through the introduction of 'roles' in classroom discussion activities.

Our children have been challenged to develop the role of 'summariser' when actively listening to a discussion between two other children. Learning to be an active listener as well as a confident talker will remain at the heart of our Oracy strategy next year.

We have strengthened our Speech and Language Support through EYFS and Key Stage 1, allowing our Early Language Leader to deliver vital professional development to all staff, that supports the ongoing delivery of Wellcomm intervention through Key Stage 1.

# Reading

We delivered our 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Book drop in Autumn Term 2024. The texts gifted to our children from EYFS to Year 6 shared an equality theme to support and develop our children's awareness of disability or common medical conditions. We hope you enjoyed sharing the books together at home.

The evaluation of our Reading Strategy was a focal point on the first day of our Ofsted Inspection (Oct 2024). The lead inspector observed 1:1 reading across the School and praised the high quality support provided by our Teaching Assistants. Our children talked avidly about our strong reading culture throughout School and talked positively about their reading experiences.



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Reading sits firmly at the heart of the curriculum. The school carefully selects high-quality literature to captivate pupils' interest and support their learning. This begins in the early years.

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### Arts and Culture

Our Curriculum continues to be enhanced by visiting artists, educational visits, School performances and creative learning opportunities. Our children's sketchbooks continue to demonstrate an exceptional standard of drawing, painting, and other art forms as our children progress through our Art and Design Curriculum. Our Arts leader continues to deliver high quality training for teaching and support staff to ensure highly effective delivery of this aspect of the Curriculum.

This year, children in Y1-Y6 have worked alongside Singing outreach specialist, Mr Harry Spender, as part of the School's Singing Programme. The impact of this initiate is evident in the children's performances and knowledge of musical vocabulary.

Working alongside Willow Artist, Cherry Chung, our children in Y2 and Y4 have created 3D sculptures for our School grounds. This was wonderful opportunity to work with natural materials - it's fantastic to see the children's work in our outdoor gallery!



## **Enrichment**

Our children continue to engage exceptionally well in a varied and exciting programme of before, lunchtime and after school enrichment opportunities. Our programme provides a wide range of artistic and sporting opportunities.

87% of pupils from Year 1 – Year 6 have attended at least one before, lunch time or after School enrichment opportunity in 2024-2025.

In Key Stage 2, 98% of children have attended an enrichment opportunity and/ or attended a competitive sporting event.

Over the course of the academic year, we have delivered 1 Outdoor Adventurous Activity day visit, 2 OAA residential visits, 23 Educational visits, attended 64 Sports fixtures and welcomed 44 visitors to School. We greatly appreciate the financial support our families provide to ensure these opportunities continue.

Our children have all had a performance opportunity this year with our EYFS Nativity, Year Group Assemblies, Carol Concert, Sing Together Concert, Y1-Y2 Musical, our House Performing Arts Competition and Y5-Y6 Show! This work impacts positively on our children's self-esteem, confidence and teamwork skills.



The support that the school provides for pupils' personal development is exceptional and is strongly linked to the school's values. For example, pupils benefit from the plethora of trips and other activities on offer to them that broaden their understanding of the wider world.

## Equality, Diversity and Inclusion

Our Equality, Diversity and Inclusion work continues to be strengthened through our strong partnerships with our families. This year, we have achieved the Lancashire Equality Mark.

# PE and School Sport

Our children continue to engage exceptionally well in our Physical Educ Curriculum and School Sport opportunities. This year we have delivered a programme of swimming – starting from Y4, with the aim of increasing the number of children achieving or exceeding the require Swimming standard by the end of Key Stage 2.

## **Technology Innovation**

Our use of technology across the Curriculum, continues to offer a breadth of tools to support and adapt our curriculum to meet the needs of all children. 1:1 devices from Y2-Y6 act as a valuable resource in lessons and the standard and development in our children's skills can now be evidenced by children in Y5 and Y6.

Our teachers have all achieved Apple Teacher Status. This equips our teachers to select and utilise Apple tools to deliver creative and collaborative projects across the curriculum.

Our Digital Literacy Curriculum from EYFS - Year 6 continues to be delivered to support our pupils in progressively developing the knowledge and skills they need to stay safe online.

This year, we have introduced new controllable devices into our Computing Curriculum. The devices are progressively introduced across the Key Stages to support our Coding Curriculum.

#### Behaviour and Ethos

Our strong sense of purpose, across all aspects of School life, continues to motivate and inspire our children. Our children's behaviour is exceptional and attendance at School remains high (96%).

The impact of our whole School approach to Emotion Coaching, introduced in January 2023, is evidenced across the School; in our pupils' ability to articulate a range of emotions and self-regulate their behaviour. We have received valuable feedback from our Parents and Carers on the whole school approach, alongside the day to day routines that support their child's 'readiness' for learning.

## Everyone a learner!

We continue to invest significantly in professional development opportunities for all staff and governors. This year, peer reviews have given teachers an opportunity to observe teaching and learning across the school – strengthening practice in all areas. We have delivered a wealth of SEND training for all staff to support for children with social and emotional needs and neurodivergence. We have continued to access a wealth of external training, utilise DFE funded training routes and support our staff in accessing Nationally recognised qualifications.

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
